Specific requirements in terms of call scope	This funding opportunity is jointly supported by the Health Research Council of New Zealand and the New Zealand Ministry of Health. The HRC-GACD Mental Health Call will focus on implementation research proposals on mental disorders among Māori and Pacific youth , including, but not limited to, depression, schizophrenia, bipolar disorders, alcohol- and drug-use disorders, etc.
Eligible institutions	The First Named Investigator must be employed by an eligible Host organization based in New Zealand.
Co-investigator requirements	The research team will require demonstrated expertise in undertaking health research, and will collectively require the skills appropriate to completing the proposed research. As the call is focused on implementation research, the team must include researchers with extensive clinical and/or policy and/or service provider experience.
Project location requirements	The research must be undertaken primarily within New Zealand, though components of the research may be undertaken in the Pacific region.
Eligible costs and further information on funding conditions	Funding will be awarded in line with standard HRC practice. Information about eligible costs can be found on the HRC's website: http://hrc.govt.nz/sites/default/files/HRC%20Rules%202016.pdf
Anticipated amount of funding available for this call	A total of \$2,000,000 is available, which is expected to fund several projects.
Notes	HRC guidance for applicants will be made available prior to the opening of the full application submission period. This will outline the process for submitting an application to the HRC-GACD fund, along with the assessment process.
